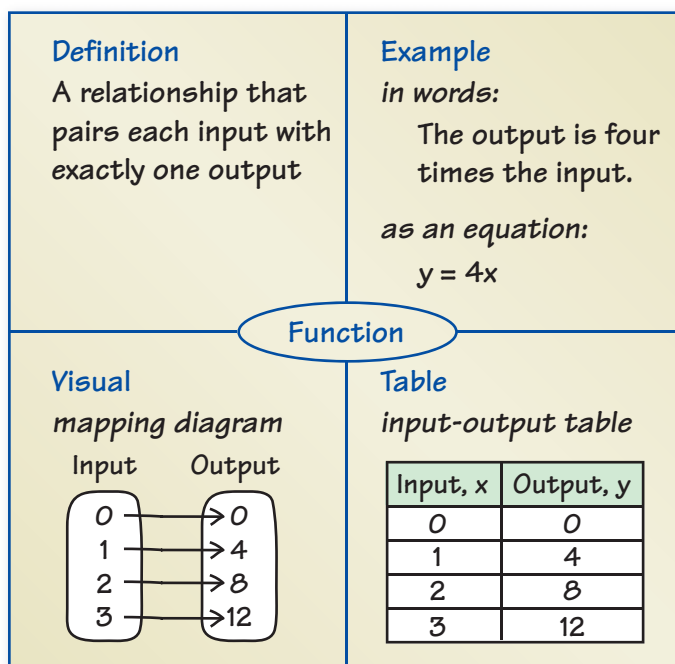


You can use a **four square** to organize information about a topic. Each of the four squares can be a category, such as *definition*, *vocabulary*, *example*, *non-example*, *words*, *algebra*, *table*, *numbers*, *visual*, *graph*, or *equation*. Here is an example of a four square for a function.
